On June 8, 9, & 10; the Western Illinois Youth Camp was filled with youth ages 12-17 for Midwest Youth Services "The Real World" camp. Jacob Barnes says, "I can help break the cycle by telling my friends about what I learned today."

Later that day, camp director Casey McDaniel cooked hamburgers and hot dogs for the campers. This was followed by "The Real World Challenge." The campers were divided into two teams and were required to finish a series of obstacles, which reflected the different skills they had learned the past few days. These obstacles consisted of coming up with a team name and chant, canoeing, a stilt walk, guiding a blind-folded partner, and building a bridge. The team with the fastest time was named the winner. Both teams worked great together and encouraged their teammates through each obstacle. By the end of the day, both teams were winners because not only did they finish the race as a team, but they each had accomplished a goal they had set out to do.



the camp staff. The first day was mostly an introductory day where everyone got to know each other. The campers made a "me" collage by cutting out pictures in magazines and drawing pictures of things they like and dislike and were given the opportunity to share with the group. This was followed by a team building/leadership activity called the "tallest tower." The campers were divided into teams of three and given a bag of supplies. Each team had the same supplies and they were asked to use every item in the bag to build a tower. At the end of ten minutes, the team that used all the items from the bag and built the tallest tower. This activity taught the campers about leadership and the importance of contributing to a team effort.

The second day of camp, we were fortunate enough to have two wonderful speakers come in and talk to the youth. Cori Wagner is the Coordinator of Career Services and Student Activities at MacMurray College. She gave a presentation to the campers about "dreams versus goals." They each shared what they wanted to be when they grow up and did an exercise to see how the things they like to do can fit into a career. They also chose one colored jelly bean and learned how the color they chose reflects their personality. Tammy Schroeder from the Job Center spoke to the campers that day as well. She discussed with them important interview tips for when they are looking for their desired jobs. One main topic of discussion was proper attire. The campers pointed out on a poster what was appropriate for a job interview and what was not. Austin Andres says, "If you come in looking sloppy, they may not take you seriously for the job and you will probably not get hired."
